



- Maintains, cleans, and feeds animals.

Other Important Duties:

- Attends required continuing education as required by law and/or Environmental Health Director; and
- Performs such other related duties as may be assigned.

**PHYSICAL REQUIREMENTS AND WORK ENVIRONMENT**

*Reasonable accommodations may be made to enable individuals with disabilities to perform essential functions of the job.*

Ability to lift in excess of 100 pounds of force occasionally and/or in excess of 50 pounds of force frequently, and/or in excess of 20 pounds of force constantly to move objects.

Frequent reaching with arms, bending, twisting, standing, walking, stooping, and climbing stairs; and

Constant sitting and/or use of the computer and office equipment.

Additionally, the following physical abilities may be required: balancing, crawling, crouching, feeling, grasping, handling, hearing, kneeling, lifting, manual dexterity, mental acuity, pulling, pushing, repetitive motion, speaking, talking, and/or visual acuity.

**REQUIRED KNOWLEDGE, SKILLS, AND ABILITIES**

*Knowledge of:* animal behavior; health regulations; county ordinances and state laws; equipment operations; and records preparation.

*Skill/Ability to:* safely and properly handle and care for animals; establish and maintain effective relationships with co-workers and the public; demonstrate proficiency in both oral and written communication; and maintain necessary certifications, Texas driver's license applicable to job responsibilities, and good driving record.

**ACCEPTABLE EXPERIENCE AND TRAINING**

High school diploma, or its equivalent;

*Or* any equivalent combination of experience and training which provides the required knowledge, skills, and abilities.

**CERTIFICATES AND LICENSES REQUIRED**

Basic Animal Control Certification by Texas Department of Health; and

Appropriate Texas driver's license.
